Throughout his years of involvement with the Torch Run, this officer has not merely been a supporter, but an active participant in many phases of the development and growth of the Torch Run. His outstanding contributions and dedication to the Torch Run has had a tremendous impact on the lives of Special Olympic athletes and their families.

This officer has been involved with the Torch Run for fifteen years. He has served as a county and area coordinator and is currently serving on the Executive Council as a regional coordinator.
